## RETREAT LEADER

### The Right Reverend Victoria Matthews

Bishop Victoria Matthews was born and grew up in Toronto. She has degrees from Trinity College, Toronto, and Yale University, New Haven, USA.

Her ministry as an ordained deacon and priest was in suburban and rural parishes in the Diocese of Toronto. She also was a tutor in liturgical theology and oversaw field placements for Trinity Divinity prior to being ordained to the episcopate in 1994.

In 1997 she was seated as the Bishop of Edmonton and in 2008 after a period as Bishop in Residence at Wycliffe College, was installed as the Bishop of the Diocese of Christchurch in New Zealand.

During her ten years in New Zealand a series of earthquakes flattened the see city included much of the Christchurch Cathedral.

After ten years in New Zealand she relocated back to Canada where she is seeking God's guidance as to where she is called to serve next.

Bishop Victoria is passionate about prayer, pilgrimage, God's call and historical theology. She is single with one (very lovely; somewhat spoiled) yellow Labrador.
